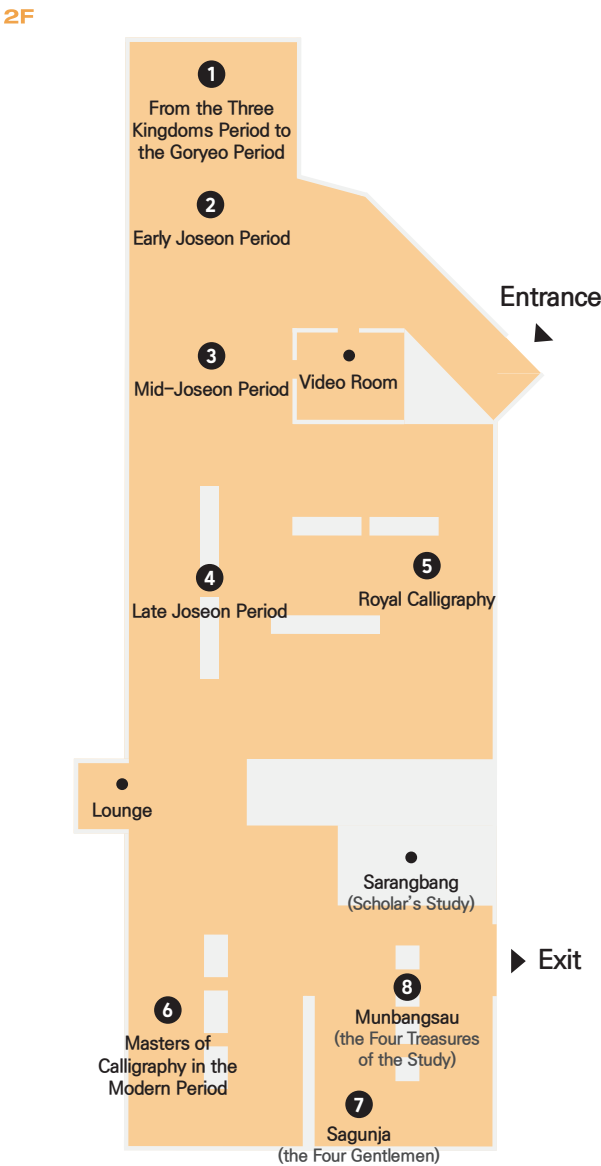

Suwon Museum of History

The Suwon Museum of History traces Suwon’s history and culture from prehistory to the present through a wide range of artifacts. The vivid recreation of a Suwon street from the 1960s invites visitors to step back in time, while a dedicated section introduces independence activists from the city.

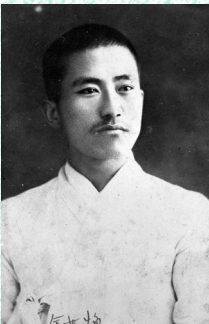

Calligraphy Museum of Korea

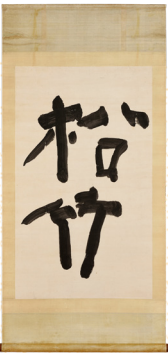
The Calligraphy Museum of Korea explores the development of Korean calligraphy by period and theme. Highlights include royal calligraphy by King Yeongjo and King Jeongjo, together with works by leading Joseon-era calligraphers such as Prince Anpyeong, Han Ho, Yun Sun, and Kim Jeong-hui. A recreated scholar’s study offers a glimpse into the life and culture of Joseon-era literati.

Outdoor Exhibition

Artifacts from various sites around Suwon are displayed throughout the museum grounds. Highlights include a dolmen from Geumgok-dong, a stone cist tomb from Imok-dong, monuments, a rock-carved Buddha triad, and ceremonial stone sculptures, all arranged in harmony with the surrounding natural landscape.
